AND SNOWS BRING FLOODING

This year has been a wet one with snows and heavy rains. Extra officers were called out along with fire departments to block roads and make rescues in the southern part of the county.

Both lakes were closed until Sunday February 10 due to the high water levels. The picture upper left shows a picture of the Sweetwater boat ramp and beach point. Earlier the water level actually cover the point completely and the marina dock was under water.

REMEMBER THIS

THERE ARE 3 THREE DIFERENT EXITS OUT OF THE CORDRY SWEETWATER CONSERVANCY DISRCT. #1 IS NINEVEH ROAD TO THE NORTH AND THE OTHER 2 ARE OFF SWEETWATER DRIVE TO THE WEST.

In the upper right corner is a picture of Nineveh Road at the bottom of Smiar's Hill. Water was 1.5 feet deep running across the road. We had to shut it down for more than an hour before we could let the traffic back through.

Sweetwater Trail was also closed from Eagle Drive going south due to the high water.

Several rescues were made in the county due to drivers trying to drive through the water.

IT TAKES LESS THAT 1 FOOT OF WATER TO CARRY YOUR CAR AWAY. DON'T TRY AND DRIVE THROUGH WATER THAT IS ACROSS THE ROAD. IT COULD TURN FATAL.
